

Process of bonding PDMS/ZnO composite to itself or Copper electrodes is developed through experimental optimization. The process of fabricating the device is given below.

There are mainly two steps for fabrication

- 1. Fabrication of Master
- 2. Fabrication of device
- a) 1.Steps for Master Fabrication
  - RCA Clean the wafer.
  - Spin coat SU8 2100 at 1600 rpm for 30 sec.
  - Pre Bake at 90C for 30 min.
  - Using swastika mask UV Exposure for 16 sec .
  - · Post bake at 90C for 30 min.
  - Develop
- b) 2.Steps for fabrication of device
  - Prepare PDMS in 5:1(5 gm) ratio and pour it on Glass petridish containing silicon wafer such that it spreads uniformly on the pertidish.
  - After spreading uniformly keep it in oven at 70 degrees centigrade for 30 to 40 minutes such that it is partially cured.
  - Remove the petridish from oven and check whether it is half-cured(surface of the PDMS should be sticky) or not. If not keep it for some more time so that it is half-cured. Then place the copper electrode (electrodes cut with swastika shape)gently on the PDMS such it should align with the pattern in the swastika.
  - Prepare PDMS + ZnO Composite (5:1 ratio) and pour it on the pertridish such that it uniformly spreads on the half-cured PDMS.
  - Again keep the petridish in oven to half-cure it i.e, 70 degree centigrade for 30 -40 min. After that remove it and again place copper electrodes on it such that the copper electrodes align with bottom copper electrodes.
  - Again pour bare PDMS (5:1 ratio) on it such that it spreads uniformly on composite surface. Keep it in oven 70 degrees for 30 min for half curing.
  - After half curing remove it from oven and place and an anchor (base) such that it should align with center of the swastika.
     After that keep it for full curing i.e, 70 degrees for 30 min.
