




Fig. 3. CC Camera at the Security Point near the Second Gate








Fig. 4. CC Camera at the Central Library




FIRST AID KITS AND FIRE EXTINGUISHERS



Separate service road by name “MB Marg” for girl students to commute from the institution to hostels and vice versa in order to ensure their safety against the traffic on main road.




Figure 1. MB Marg for Girl Students to Commute from Institution to Hostels and Vice Versa






Figure 2. Ramp Pathway towards Parking near PAT Office for Physically Disabled

Memorandum of Engagement. Students/Faculty/Staff of SVEC herein afterwards, shall be referred to as "**SVEC Users**".

3. The Client and The Service Provider are termed as the party and collectively called the parties under the framework of this engagement.
4. SVEC has students, faculty and staff members from different regions, cultures, socioeconomic backgrounds, age groups, religions, interests, etc., from India and abroad. The client is now seeking to manage the well-being of their campus community and believes a web platform like YourDOST could possibly help in this direction.
5. The Service Provider having the requisite experience is capable of providing counseling through online and face to face channels.
6. Therefore, The Client in furtherance of their objectives wishes to avail and engage the services offered by The Service Provider. In return, The Service Provider agrees to render their services and the client accepts the same, as per the terms, given below in this Memorandum of Engagement.
7. The effective date of commencement under this MOU shall be **1st July 2019** ("**Effective Date**")
8. The Client agrees to the following:
 - a) To provide a slot to spread awareness about YourDOST to the students during orientation.
 - b) To provide assistance in terms of mailers/newsletters, to be sent to the campus community at a predetermined frequency for increasing the usage if necessary.
 - c) To provide support of Clients' network administrator to enable user tagging based on SVEC IP address.
 - d) To provide necessary facilities to conduct workshops with students
9. The Service Provider agrees to the following benefits to SVEC as part of the agreement:
 - a) Access to 24 x 7 x 365 unlimited text counseling through pre-vetted experts (psychologists, counselors, career coaches, life coaches) for instant help
 - b) 60 Audio/Video Sessions per month available for users who would like to avail escalated support
 - c) 1 visiting counselor would be provided at the Tirupati campus for face to face

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counseling of college and school students. Two visits of 5 hours each are provided every month as part of this agreement.

- d) 1 visiting counselor would be provided at the Hyderabad campus for face to face counseling of school students. Two visits of 3 hours each are provided every month as part of this agreement.
- e) Access to the discussion forums and 2000+ articles dealing with relevant issues
- f) Awareness webinars and other communication interventions to promote engagement of students on the platform.
- g) An orientation session for students on campus would be included as a part of the offering.
- h) Awareness workshops to challenge negative connotations. 1 workshop every quarter is included as part of the offering. Others can be offered on demand and will be charged separately.
- i) Aggregate monthly reports for Administration - on anonymized data to resolve thematic issues
- j) Inform the representative of the client for critical cases (suicidal tendencies), so that timely action could be taken by the authorities to prevent this (if possible).

10. Commercials:

- A. The Client agrees that for the services provided under this MoU (as mentioned in clause 9(a-j)), it shall pay to the Service Provider, an amount of INR 8,00,000/- (eight lakhs only) plus taxes per annum. 50% of the amount shall be paid in advance at the start of the engagement and the rest shall be paid at the end of 6 months.
- B. Any services availed outside the ones described in clause 9 would be charged as per the rates mentioned in Annexure 1 with prior permission from the client.
- C. No refunds or concessions or adjustments will be provided by the Service Provider, in the unlikely event of cancellation of the agreement.
- D. The Client agrees to provide travel, boarding and lodging or reimburse expenses on actuals, for all visits/all purposes that are made during the period of this understanding.
- E. All reimbursements shall be pre-approved by the Client.
- F. All reimbursement claims shall be settled by the Client within one month from the date of submission of claims.
- G. All payments and reimbursements shall be done either by cheque or online wire transfer to the account of "YourDOST Health Solutions Pvt Ltd."


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11. The Client and The Service Provider understand and accept the complex nature of this engagement. While both the parties shall strive and commit resources to achieve the objectives of the Client, each of the parties is aware, the following events may happen during the course of the engagement:

For the purposes of this clause, email communication from the registered mail addresses of the parties shall also be binding. Communication shall mean to include hard copies of letters, agreements, reports, documents, invoices, claims, photographs, word documents, spreadsheets, PDF files, PPT's, scanned copies, email attachments or any other form the parties specifically accept as binding on each other. Wherever it is found, feasible, relevant, possible, legally necessary, digital signatures shall also be acceptable to the parties.

13. The Client agrees to indemnify the Service Provider against any wrongful deeds, actions directly attributable to the Client and in turn the Service Provider also agrees to indemnify the Client for any wrongful deeds or actions directly attributable to the Service Provider. The parties further agree to cooperate with each other, so as to defend any third party suits, claims, injunctions, restraint orders, police complaints, court orders, summons or any other legal proceedings, brought against either of the parties

The terms of this engagement, communication between the parties in furtherance of this engagement, documents, reports, discussions, actions and outcomes relating to the subject matter of this engagement and any other information the parties specifically wish, shall be confidential at all times. This confidentiality shall subsist even after the termination of this engagement. For the purpose of this clause, the subject matter of engagement means, the person who is availing or for whom the service is provided under the terms of this engagement.
16. In the event of any information relating to this engagement or to the subject matter in question is demanded by law or during the course of a medical emergency, such passing of information by either party shall not be deemed to be a breach of confidentiality.
17. It is understood that mention of names of either of the parties in corporate communication or mentioning as partner shall not be construed as a breach of confidentiality.
18. Termination of Engagement:
- This engagement may be terminated by either party, without assigning any reason whatsoever, by giving a written notice of Two months.
 - The Service provider reserves the right to terminate this engagement without giving any notice, when The Client has failed to settle financial dues within 30 days from the date they have become due. Furthermore The Service Provider reserves the right to charge interest at the rate of 12% per annum for all sums that are outstanding.
 - Upon termination of this engagement, both parties within a period of 30 days, hand over, all documents, reports, case discussions papers, etc., that are


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






Figure 4. MB Marg for Girl Students to Commute from Institution to Hostels and Vice Versa Dispensary with Network Hospital at Tirupati and Ambulance Services are made available in the institution for the safety of health of the inmates. Further, Girls Common Room and Boys Common Room are available for the benefit of students.







DISHA app also integrated with needful information like nearby safety places, nearby police stations, nearby hospitals and useful contacts. DISHA contains tracking safety feature for every user. This APP also gives you phone numbers that you can dial to get emergency help and support. DISHA also contains links like Helpline Numbers.


She also added that “We are setting up an exclusive control room for distress calls from women. The GPS console will track the nearest emergency response vehicle and automatically dispatch it to the spot. The cameras on the vehicle will shoot videos which can be used as evidence during the trial.” The application has latest features such as recording video and audio. The app is helpful in presenting substantial and conclusive evidence with audio/video clips.





REPORT **DAY 1**







The yoga calms the brain and enhances its vital functioning. He added his personal experience after yoga in his life.

Art of living has recognized that the fear and anxiety of the pandemic, the stress from the lockdown and isolation; and the uncertainty about the economy, jobs and future were affecting people's mental health and well-being. The session started with a prayer to almighty by **Sri. S.V. Suresh.**

The session started with a short prayer to almighty by **Sri. S.V. Suresh** followed by "how yoga helps in increasing life skills?" Can I practice yoga during the COVID-19" The answer is yes.

Regular practice of yoga has shown effective results. Different asanas boost immunity, build the body's strength, increase energy levels, bring down anxiety and stress, infuses positivity and freshness in the mind. Lack of sleep, poor nutrition, and life stress all lead to a weakened immune system and vulnerability to sickness. Stress, more than anything, leads to a breakdown in the body's ability to defend itself against bacteria and viruses.

The speaker also added that Aasanas are part of yoga and Yoga is not just doing aasanas but the integration of all body parts through breath control. Sri. S. V. Suresh garu also explained how to handle emotions in life using Life Management Skills. In order to have a positive attitude, stress free mind, violent free society and healthy mind Yoga Pranayama and Aasanas is of prime importance.

Later the speaker started demonstrating various asanas.



Lacking this skill is the biggest issue faced by society today, and this has to be developed. It is never perfect, some ups and downs do happen in this matter. Like, what we feel, we cannot express fully, and cannot understand correctly what others feel.

This keeps happening in life but when we become more calm and happy, we are able to understand others' minds more and more. That's why it is very necessary to do meditation, pranayama, etc. That gives more inner clarity, and then we feel that others can understand us better, and also we can express our views better.

He also stated that powers and skills are within you but in sleeping mode so we need Suprabatham to wake it up and various Pranayamas to observe rhythm of breath.

Benefits of Pranayama

- The regular practice of breathing exercises can completely change the quality of life that one is leading.
- Increases and enhances the quantity and quality of prana, thereby increasing our energy levels
- Clears blocked nadis and chakras, thereby expanding your aura and heightening the spirit
- Makes one energetic, enthusiastic, calmer and positive. Such a state of mind helps us in making better decisions, having mental strength when dealing with adversities and feeling happier
- Brings harmony between the body, mind, and spirit, making one physically, mentally and, spiritually strong
- It brings clarity to the mind and good health to the body

Sri. S. V. Suresh explained various asanas which helps our mind to come out of clusters of thought. He also added that just as the knowledge of Yoga is vast and deep, so are its benefits. The practice of yoga benefits the body, mind and spirit.

Benefits for the body

- Improves flexibility of muscles and joints




The workshop on 23-06-2021 started virtually through Zoom platform between 9.30 am to 10.30 am.

To deal with the weight of expectations of your parents, teachers and yourself? Luckily, yes he stated. He gave some tips which helps participants to calm their nerves, increase concentration and will help to achieve their goal.

The speaker addressed on the fact that *skills need to wake up within us* which we already acquired we need to wake it up and polish it by Yoga, Aasana and Meditation. He also stated that powers and skills are within you but in sleeping mode. It's very important to observe rhythm of breath for a happy life.

Sri S.V.Suresh added that the Art of Living says "Encourage children to be more energetic through proper food, physical exercise. Reduce the load on their heads. Parents and peers should not exert pressure on children. When children do yoga, meditation, play creative and co-operative games, not competitive games, their energy levels go up. This results in them paying more attention to their studies."

The Speaker also elucidated about various preparedness for the exams in order to succeed in life.

Pre-Examination Preparedness:

- Sleep well. Without physical and mental rest, memory and concentration are not strong. A tired mind will not focus or retain information well.
- Try and wake up at sunrise, and followed by simple breathing exercises like Nadishodhan Pranayama and Ujjai breathing. This way, stress is eliminated from your body and mind and energy levels rise.
- Use Meditation as a study tool. Practice any simple meditation for a few minutes just before you start your studies. It helps you relax, learn fast, and retain longer, without getting distracted.
- Once you are ready to start, sit down and start studying. No excuses, no postponement.
- Plan your time: Draw a revision timetable schedule and include some time for periodic relaxation breaks. This helps internalize what you have studied and also increases concentration.


- Eat right: fresh, light, homemade vegetarian food will help to increase your ability to concentrate and increase energy levels.

During exams:

- Before you enter the exam hall, relax. Don't stress yourself more by overloading your brain. You don't have to study any more at that time.
- If you feel tense during an exam, take deep long breaths. Observe your breath going in and out and feel your calmness and balance return.
- Don't under-estimate the power of prayer. Prayer also helps your mind to focus, concentrate and defuse anxiety.





The session started with the welcome note by Dr.M.S.Sujatha and Mr.G.Kuladeep, Co-Ordinator of the workshop.






The session started with a short meditation for beginners followed by “Can yoga help me boost immunity? Can I practice yoga during the COVID-19” The answer is yes.




regulated sleep, which is crucial for wellness; sleep is one of the most important factors in healing and maintaining a healthy immune system.


The faculties added simple yoga poses that boost immunity during COVID-19 situation.



Apana Mudra:











- May even slow down the aging process.











1. Prevent and respond to gender-based violence

Rates of gender-based violence (GBV) can be particularly high in fragile and crisis-affected recovery settings, which has adverse implications for sustainable, inclusive recovery and resilience-building. This debate targeted advice to: i) mainstream GBV across all work in recovery settings; ii) promote GBV prevention by enhancing empowerment and awareness of all stakeholders; iii) increase effectiveness of GBV response; iv) support gender-responsive disarmament and mine action after violent conflict; and v) support institutions that ensure the realization of women’s economic, social and cultural rights.

2. Promote transformative livelihoods and economic recovery and resilience to advance gender equality.

Gender-responsive post-crisis economic recovery and resilience programmes ensure that women have equitable access to productive resources and viable employment opportunities. This Toolkit provides targeted advice to: i) ensure gender-responsiveness in immediate livelihood restoration and access to socio-economic services; ii) promote a lifecycle approach to women’s economic empowerment; and iii) promote women’s resilience through gender-responsive economic recovery.

3. Promote the participation and leadership of women and women’s organizations in crisis and recovery

The meaningful participation and leadership of diverse women in gender-responsive recovery and resilience processes helps to ensure that issues pertinent to both women and gender equality are identified and addressed. This discussion included guidance to: i) promote gender-responsive conflict and disaster prevention; ii) promote women’s engagement in crisis and recovery; and iii) build capacities and partnerships with women’s civil society.

Dr. V.Sumathi, started with the caption, “Access to good nutrition is a universal human right”. Nutrition International believes that good nutrition and gender equality are mutually reinforcing; improving nutrition is critical to achieving gender equality, and in turn improving gender equality leads to improved nutrition.

The resource person emphasized, that Girls with access to good nutrition are better able to learn. Well-nourished girls with access to education learn more and earn more over their lifetimes. When women come together as trained community health care workers, as mothers, and/or community decision-makers, they and their communities benefit. They share their first-hand knowledge, collectively discuss and take action on existing nutritional barriers and engage in local health agendas. Men have many roles in society, as fathers, partners, brothers, teachers, health care providers and leaders. Access to positive male role models that enable more equitable distribution of household nutrition, health decision-making, caregiving or professional health-related responsibilities promotes gender equality, women’s empowerment and nutrition in the short and long term.

When nutrition programming recognizes household gender power relations and ensures both partners and all family members are informed and involved, in decision-making for improved nutrition, such as supporting optimal breastfeeding practices or taking daily or weekly iron-folic acid supplements for anaemia prevention, it promotes long-term advances gender equality.

When women and men are empowered to claim their rights, it leads to improved health and nutrition for themselves and a better quality of life for their families and communities. The participation and support of men and boys alongside women and girls in reaching gender equality is essential. However, achieving gender equality will not be possible as long as women and girls around the world remain twice as likely to suffer from malnutrition than men and boys.

Nutrition International has considered evidence in four areas while developing its **Program Gender Equality Strategy**:

1. How social norms can lead to gender inequalities in nutrition.
2. How women and girls can have increased nutritional needs during the lifecycle and may be at a greater risk of food insecurity.


3. How empowered and educated mothers have better nourished families; and how adequate nutrition is essential to grow, learn, earn and lead.
4. How improving nutrition for women, adolescent girls, and children lays the foundation for their current and future education, productivity and economic empowerment.

Women suffering from lack of access to decent work and face occupational segregation and gender wage gaps. In many situations, they

are denied access to basic education and health care and are victims of violence and discrimination. They are under-represented in political and economic decision-making processes.

He concluded the talk saying that the vital role of women and the need for their full and equal participation and leadership in all areas of sustainable development is to be reaffirmed in the Future.






An Awareness Programme on

We need to market engineering as a rewarding, varied profession, with ample opportunities and female role models.

Also, she discussed about different careers after B.Tech. Her lecture enlightened the gathering on the effective communication and how to face the interviews and Choose the right path for the students.

The establishment of National Women Commission and State Women Commissions were important milestones in the direction of Women Empowerment in India.

However development is not sustainable if it is unequal. Despite significant government and non-government initiatives the fact remains that we still witness dowry deaths, domestic violence and exploitation of women. The male female ratio though improved over last few years is still far from satisfactory. The female literacy rate is also lower than the male literacy rate.

Therefore, strategies must be designed to enhance the capacity of women and empower them to create a climate in which there is no gender discrimination and women and girls have full opportunities of self-decision making and to participate in the social, political and economic life of the country with a sense of equality.

She also discussed about few eminent personalities like Indira Gandhi was an Indian politician and a central figure of the Indian National Congress. She was the first and, to date, only female Prime Minister of India. Sarojini Naidu was an Indian political activist and poet. A proponent of civil rights, women's emancipation, and anti-imperialistic ideas, she was an important figure in India's struggle for independence from colonial rule and Chandra kochhar is the former managing director and chief executive officer of ICICI Bank.


An Awareness Programme on

Sunil Kumar, Professor and Head, Department of CSE at 10.00 AM in Room no:133.

Dr. K. Reddy Madhavi was the resource person for the workshop focused on “Poverty Measurement: Men Vs Women”. She enlightened the audience about gender differences in the poverty-generating processes, particularly focusing on the experiences of women and asking whether they form a disproportionate and growing contingent among the poor. The studies that confirm gender inequalities, particularly in access to and fulfillment of basic needs, support the claim that “female poverty cannot be comprised under the same conceptual approach as male poverty.” Poverty indicators are usually based on household information, without acknowledging the large gender and generational differences that exist within households.

Dr. K. Reddy Madhavi pondered upon the definition of poverty and determined what indicators will be used for its measurement as well as the type of policies that should be implemented to overcome it.

Child marriage in India, according to the Indian law, is a marriage where either the woman is below age 18 or the man is below age 21. Most child marriages involve underage women, many of whom are in poor socio-economic conditions.

The minimum legal age for marriage, since 1978, has been 18 for women and 21 for men. The child marriage prevention laws have been challenged in Indian courts, with some Muslim Indian organizations seeking no minimum age and that the age matter be left to their personal law. Child marriage is an active political subject as well as a subject of continuing cases under review in the highest courts of India.

Parents of a child entering into a child marriage are often poor and use the marriage as a way to make her future better, especially in areas with little economic opportunities. Poverty in India has been cited as a cause of early marriages. Child marriages of girls are a way out of desperate economic conditions, and way to reduce the expenses of a poor family. Many prevention programmes have been undertaken by the Indian Government to prevent child marriages.

It helps students to gain knowledge on consequences, Laws against child marriages, prevention programmes, legal actions, origin and causes of child marriage.

The department of Electrical and Electronics Engineering organised a lecture with an objective of creating awareness on gender equality and women empowerment.

Dr. S. Farook, Professor, Department of Electrical and Electronics Engineering addressed the gathering. He started his lecture with a few statistical reports - IT-enabled services sector in India provides direct employment to three million people and indirect employment to 10 million, many of them being the young women. Technology and internet connectivity have opened up other options for women as well. In a country where far less than 10 percent of the jobs are in the formal sector, women's chances of having a shot at 'regular jobs' is very poor, so starting and sustaining businesses without huge investments is a boon. He then explained about the measures taken up by the Indian government to enable small female entrepreneurs to connect directly with consumers.

Dr. Farook explained that even automation benefits women in onerous tasks. He exemplified all his points with real time examples in various industries like: garment industry (Addis Ababa, Ethiopia), Tannery etc.

Dr. Farook concluded on a positive note that the increase of female students in colleges would naturally results in more and more female professionals in financial and high-tech industries. He was certain that this would certainly bolster women's participation in the economy.


