Gender issues arise because of the fact that there is a huge imbalance between men and women though they strictly ought to be standing equally. 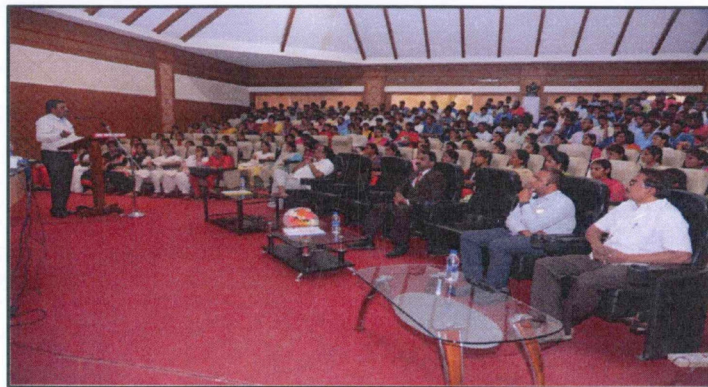

The students were enamored by a few of the facts disclosed by the resource person. It was a surprise for them to learn that 95% of institutes in Germany offer free education. Technical universities also offer arts and humanities degree courses. To avoid extravagant use of financial resources only limited allowance is provided regularly to a student. A student can stay in Germany for 18 months even after the course and can do part-time jobs all-through. Learning German is necessary for students aspiring to go to Germany.

The resource person brought to light that Germany is a cradle for numerous discoveries and has been the learning centre of many a scholars. The German universities boast of royalty incomes and offer internationally recognized degree. The universities also have Nobel laureates as their faculty members

As a Principal Consultant of e^xcs she expressed that her company would take care of all the formalities required for the smooth transition of a student from India to Germany. She explained to the students how her company can help them to pursue their higher education in Germany. Exponent Consultancy Services personnel help aspiring students from initial step like reviewing the CV to applying to appropriate university to Pre-departure and travel counseling.

About 476 III B.Tech students who attended the session were highly benefited by the session and had clearer vision of opportunities for Higher education in Germany.

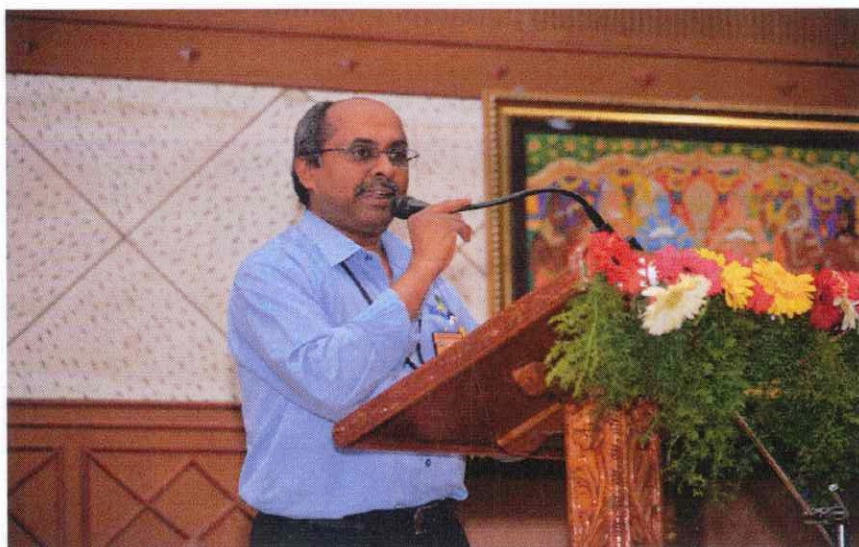

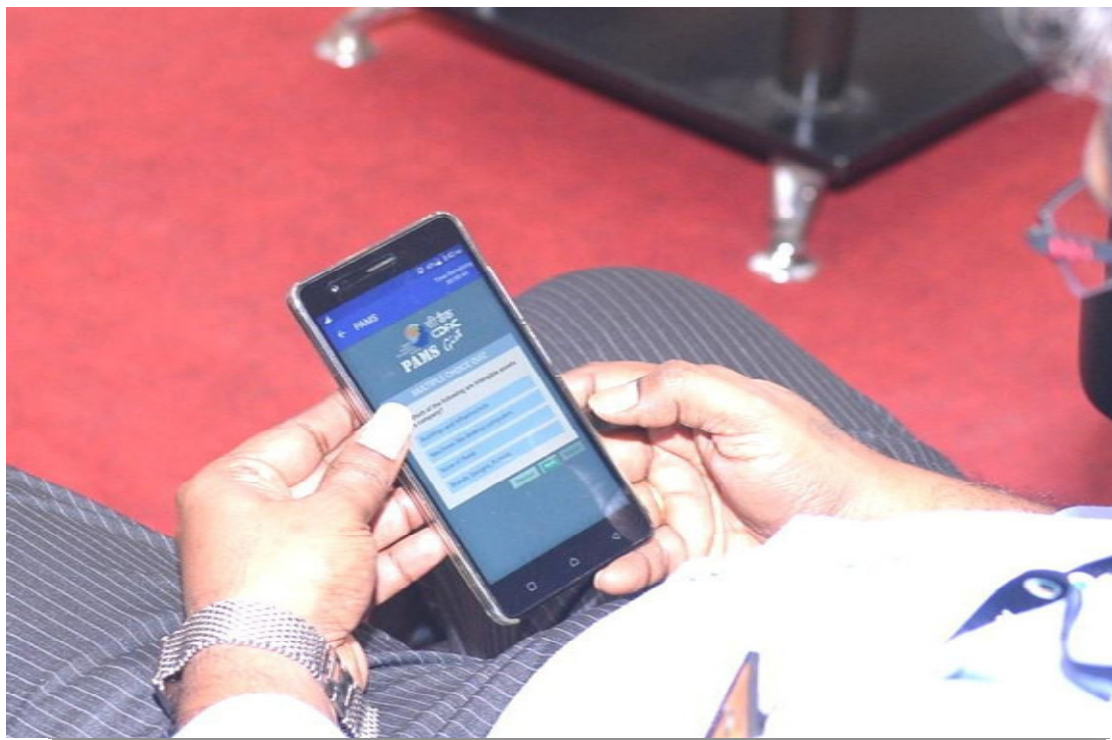

(29th November 2017)

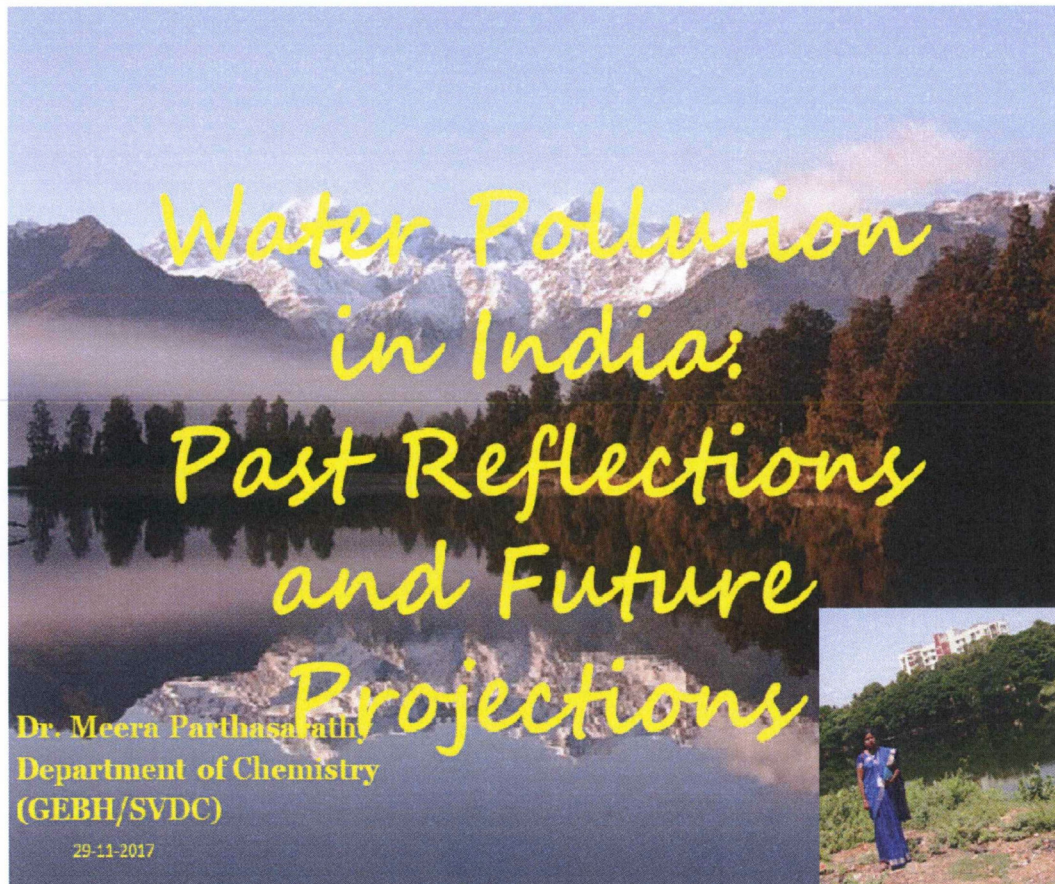

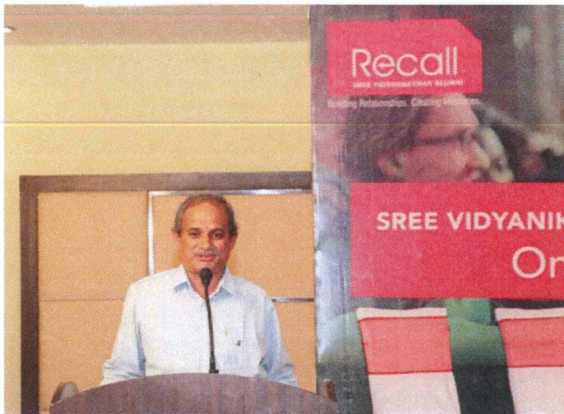

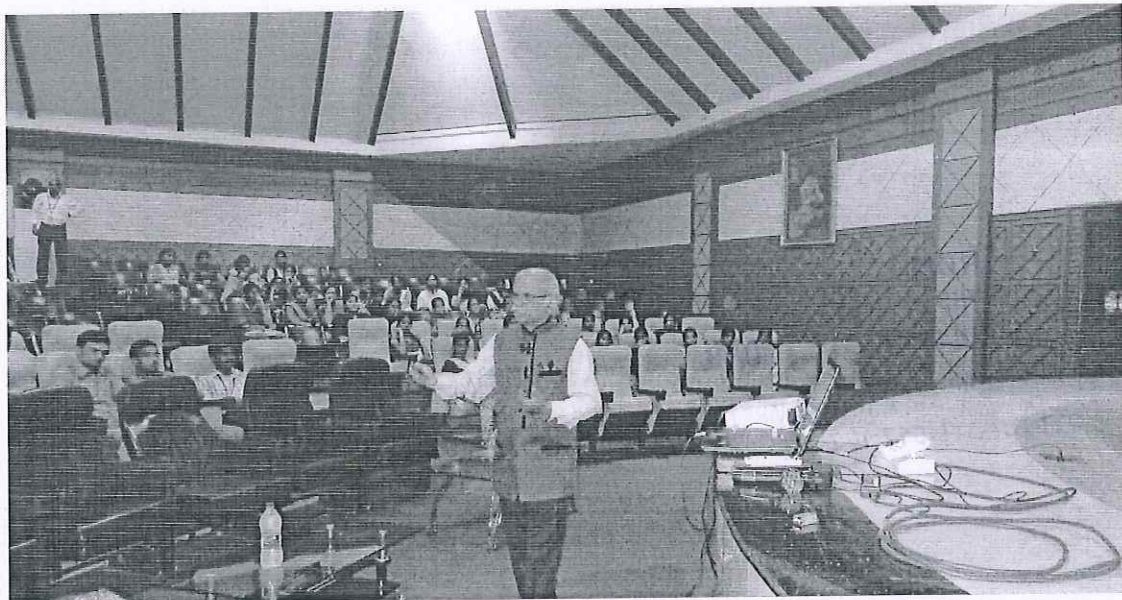

The team young caliber has spent a quality time with the students and asked the needs for the Orphanage. The children spoke very well with the team and almost played

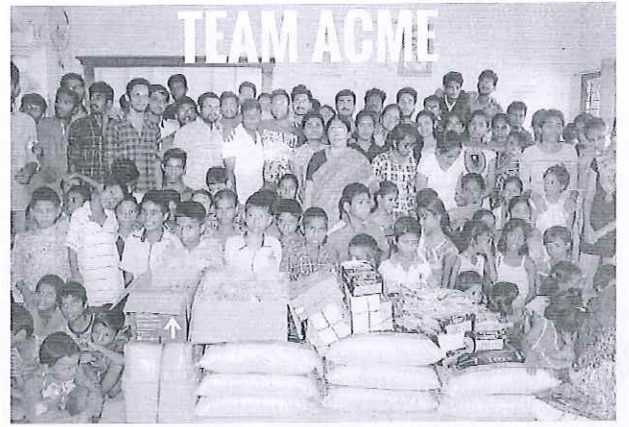
for 5 Hours. Almost 95 people attended the event and the children were totally engaged

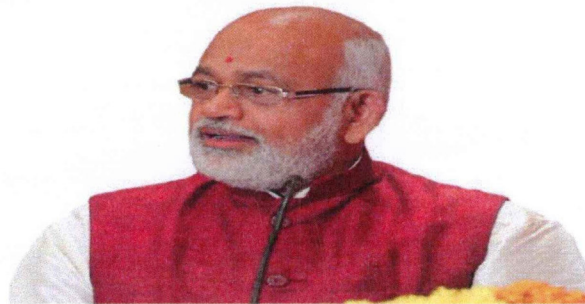

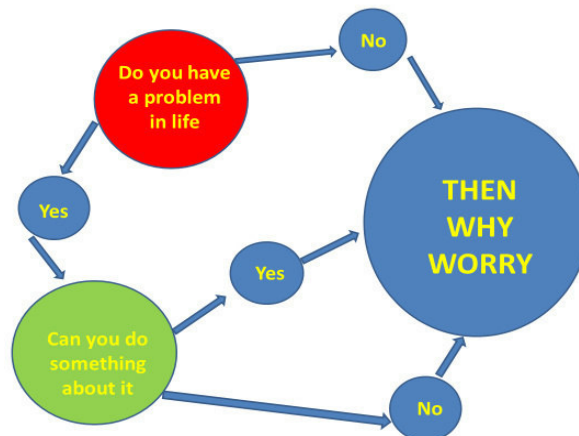
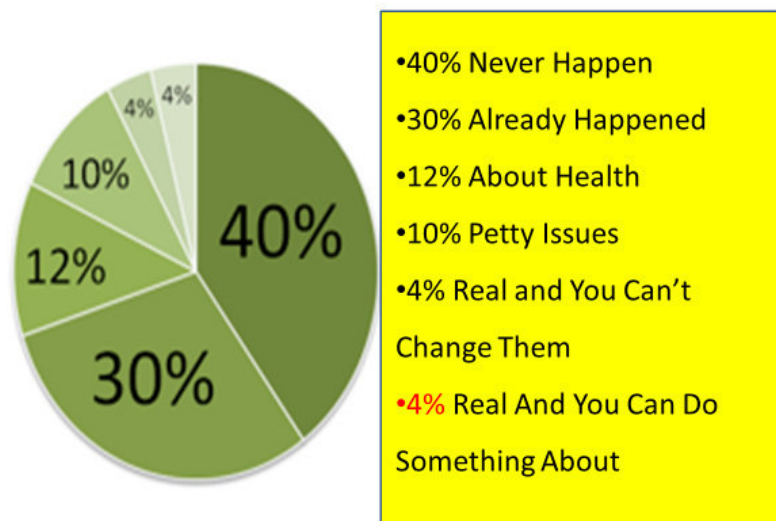

A Semi Technical Talk on Power of Positive Mind

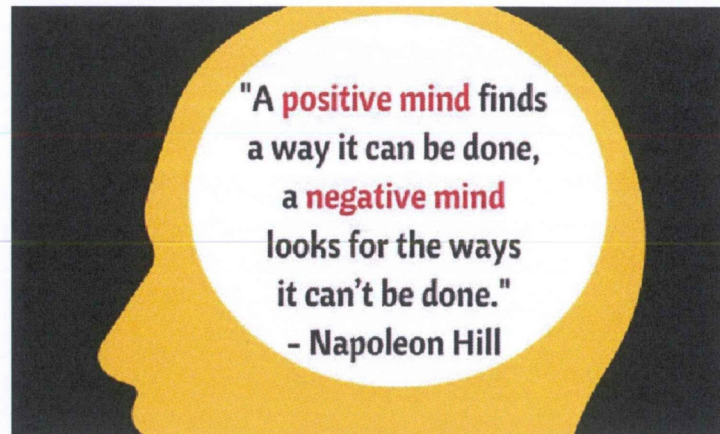
(30-08-2017)

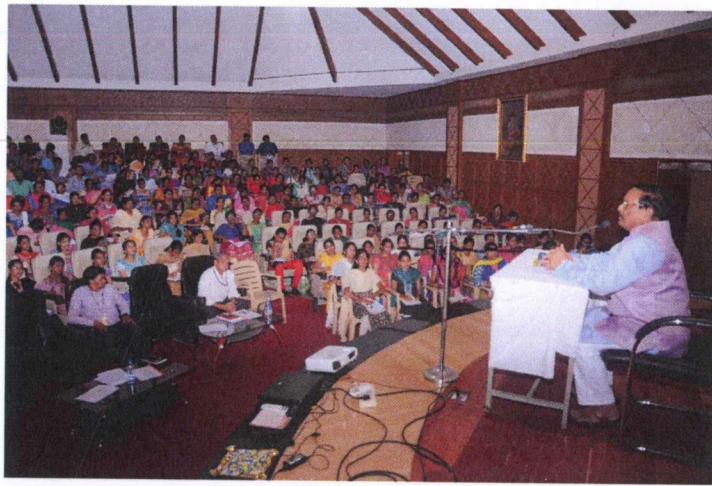

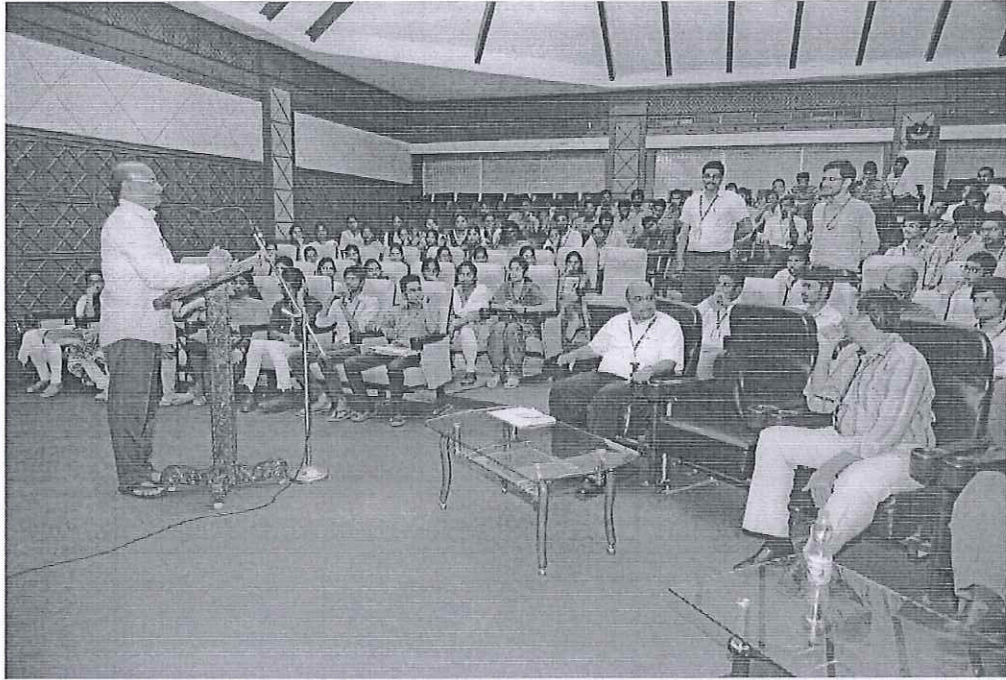

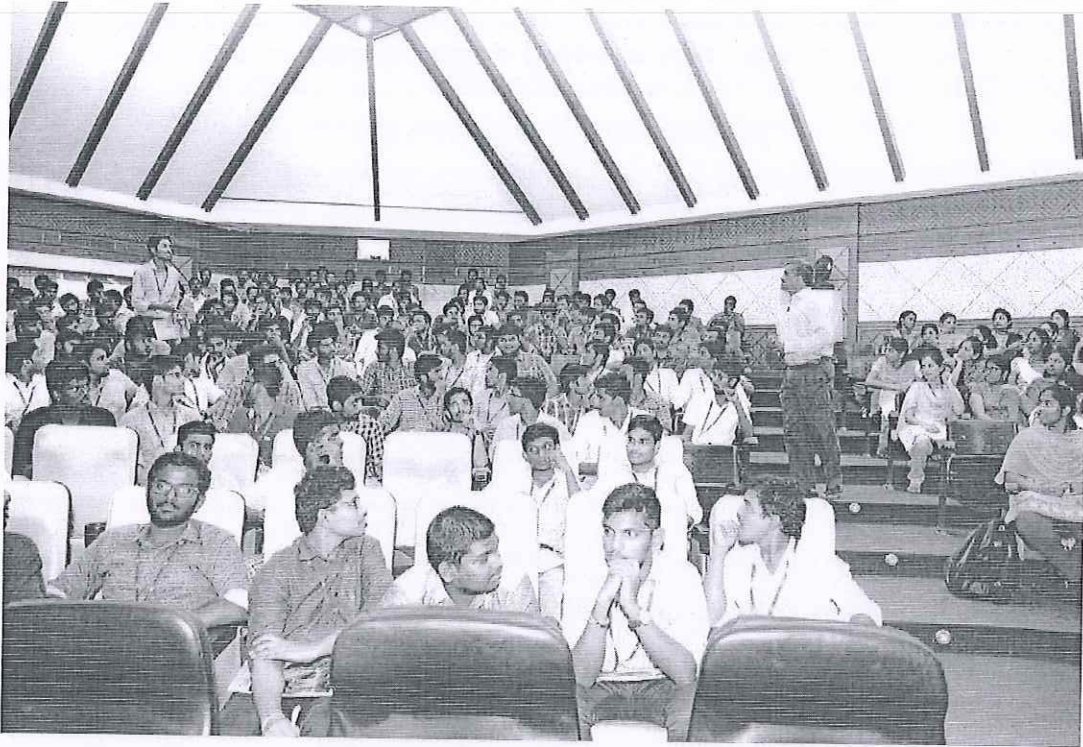

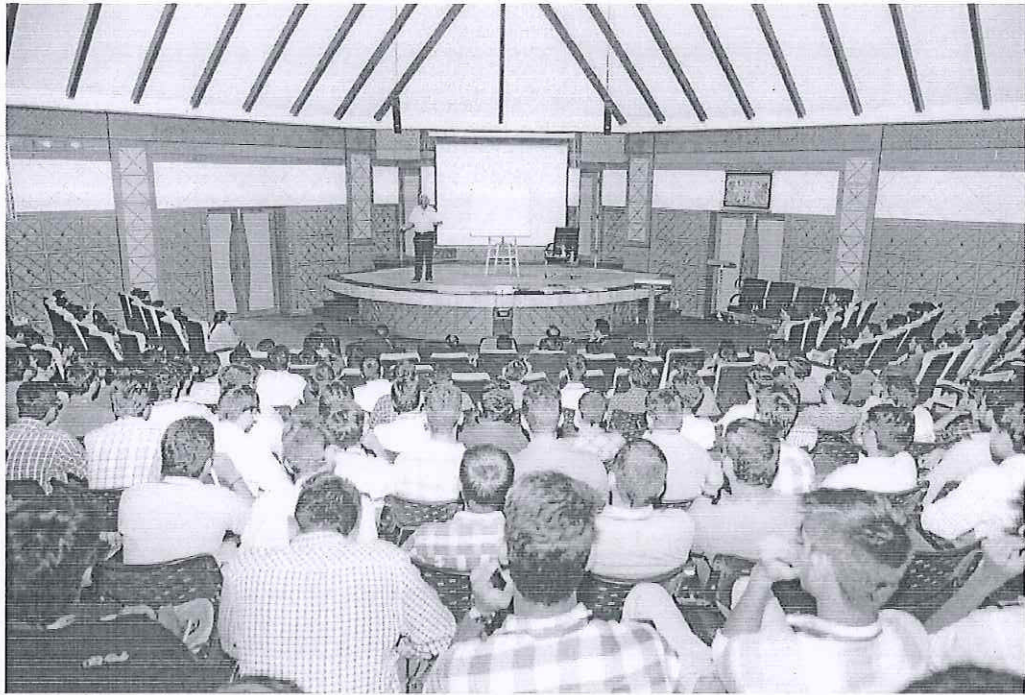

Andhra Pradesh Higher Education English Communication Skills Project - Teachers' Training Program

(June & July 2017)

Andhra Pradesh Higher Education English Communication Skills Project in collaboration with the British Council identified Sree Vidyanikethan Engineering College, Tirupati as one of the participating institutes. This project aims to improve the English for Employability Skills of students of Higher Education Institutions and to transform Andhra Pradesh into knowledge hub by providing quality education as per the vision set out by our Honorable Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Sri Nara Chandra Babu Naidu. The initiative includes a strong emphasis on building institutional capacity.

Out of 114 Master Trainers identified for this pilot project, two of our English faculty Dr.M.Ravichand, Associate Professor, SVEC and Mr.J.Ravindra Das, Assistant Professor, SVEC were selected as Master Trainers who were trained by British Council.

The training program was conducted in 2 Blocks for a span of ten days. Block I from 19th -23rd June 2017 and Block II from 3rd -7th July 2017. 36 Faculty members of the College from different disciplines have participated and benefited in the Teachers' Training cascading program trained by Master Trainers, Dr. M. Ravichand and Dr.K. Madhu Murthy.

The Valedictory for this training program was organized in English Language and Communication Skills Lab on 7th July 2017. Dr.M.Ravichand, Nodal Officer presided over the function. Dr.A.V.M.Prasad, HOD, BS & H addressed the gathering. Speaking in the Valedictory session, the Chief Guest, Dr.P.C.Krishnamachary, Principal, reiterated the faculty to train the students effectively to improve their English and employability skills.
