# Workshop on "Teacher Development Program"


Sree Vidyanikethan Engineering College organized a workshop on "Teacher Development Program" during 16-17, September, 2019.



#### **Fundamental Rights and Duties**



C Madhusudhan Rao discussed on Introduction to the Fundamental Rights.He discussed on the importance of fundamental duties andtheir relevance in the 21st century. He spoke on how fundamental duties were initially not a part of the original constitution but introduced later through the 42nd amendment which made vision to the entire constitution during the period of emergency.
